Statement by UH Mānoa Chancellor Virginia Hinshaw

I am directing that the UH Mānoa travel list and expenses for the 2008 Allstate Sugar Bowl be released today, consistent with our intention to be as open and transparent as possible. We have not yet received the Sugar Bowl proceeds from the WAC, nor have we paid all the vendors, so these revenues and expenditures are still draft until that happens.

There is value in remembering that the work necessary for UH Mānoa to participate in our first BCS Bowl was enormous, but well worth the effort. This involved transporting about 550 players, coaches, band, cheering squad, Rainbow Dancers, support staff, and other members of the UHM 'ohana, and nearly 5 tons of equipment over 4,000 miles on 3 planes during the holidays, as well as arranging for practices, lodging, feeding, ground transportation, security, and celebrations for our supporters and fans.

The time frame for accomplishing this was very short -- it wasn't until the closing seconds of our December 1st game against Washington that an undefeated regular season was assured. Between the receipt of our bid to the Sugar Bowl on December 2nd until our team's departure on Christmas Day, we had about three weeks to arrange this event -- and a momentous task it was. The UH Manoa employees that made this happen were tremendously dedicated and worked extremely hard throughout their holidays to make this dream a reality for our student athletes, university and state.--- and, afterwards, they returned to mountains of their regular work that had to wait during the Sugar Bowl time. I respect their efforts and believe we all owe them a big mahalo.

This was our first time orchestrating an event at this level, so there was much to learn, but the goal is to have many such opportunities in the future. When the Sugar Bowl regulations were made available to us, we were required to make decisions quickly about what needed to get done, who was needed to do the work, how we would go, and how to maximize the opportunity for the University. We made these decisions knowing that, because of our distance, we would have to be leaner than other schools to conserve the resources that the Sugar Bowl could provide to our program. We made these decisions based on extensive conversations with our fellow WAC school Boise State on their travel to the Fiesta Bowl, along with our own knowledge of other schools' policies and our experiences with the Sheraton Hawaii Bowl.

After returning from the Sugar Bowl, our employees had to accumulate and check all of the information about the costs, a sizeable undertaking while doing their normal jobs. As that was being completed, we did alert our employees, and their unions, that, to comply with the 92F request, we would be releasing the names of all employees whose expenses were paid with any Bowl proceeds. That was done to ensure they were fully aware of any and all costs and also out of respect for people's concern about being subjected to publicity -- a concern justified by the attention this has received.

The experience of going to the Sugar Bowl was a thrill for the whole State, demonstrated the power of Warrior Football and gave us an opportunity to share the great aloha of the State of Hawaii and UH Mānoa. Our goal is to participate regularly in BCS bowl trips and, as that happens, we will learn and become even more proficient, similar to schools like Georgia that plan for and make such bowls nearly every year. This was a great first run. We are exceptionally grateful to those who made the trip with us and, with the continued support of the state, we hope we can all make the trip again real soon. Mahalo to all of the folks that made this great experience possible.

Travel Guidelines 2008 Sugar Bowl

The guidelines were developed by the Athletics Director in collaboration with the Chancellor's Office. The guidelines are informed by conversations with Boise State officials regarding their trip to the 2007 Fiesta Bowl, information gathered from several other Universities that have previously participated in BCS bowl games, and conversations with the Commissioner of the Western Athletic Conference. Allowances for coaches, student-athletes, administrators, staff, and official party members to bring guests were aligned with the information we received through our research of how other schools have administered their BCS travel opportunity. Bowl games routinely plan events for guests to attend and provide services such as childcare due to the time of year that the games occur and the common practice of Universities inviting family members to attend. Participation in an event such as the Sugar Bowl is to be interpreted as a reward for performance and not meant to separate families during the holiday season.

1. All travel to the site of the Sugar Bowl was on charter aircraft scheduled by the University of Hawaii Athletics Department. Any deviations were pre-approved by the Athletics Director. A list of all pre-approved travel deviations involving coaches, administrators, or staff and their guests is documented on the Sugar Bowl Travel List. Student-athlete travel exceptions were allowed as per NCAA Bylaw 16.8.1.5.
2. Student-athletes, their spouse, and children were invited on the trip and provided airfare, lodging, and per diem as allowed by NCAA Bylaw 16.6.1.1. Travel to a BCS bowl game is one of the few times that NCAA allows the institution to pay for the student-athletes immediate family to travel.
3. Football coaches, graduate assistant football coaches, and strength coaches were invited on the trip and allowed to bring a spouse and children. Airfare, lodging, and per diem were offered.
4. Full-time trainers and full-time equipment managers who were assigned to travel with football during the year were invited on the trip and allowed to bring a spouse and children. Airfare, lodging, and per diem were offered. While the WAC policy allows for 64 student-athletes to travel, the NCAA allows all student-athletes to travel to a bowl game. To address the increase in student-athletes traveling to the Sugar Bowl (111) four additional trainers and four additional equipment managers were brought on the trip. The additional athletic training and equipment staff members that accompanied the team on the trip were chosen by the head athletic trainer and the equipment manager and included student assistants. Two doctors, the Team Doctor and an Orthopedist, normally travel with the team on trips. Due to the increase in student-athletes traveling to the Sugar Bowl a third doctor was added to the Sugar Bowl travel roster. One of the doctors was not able to join the team for the entire trip due to commitments he had with his practice.
5. The Official Travel Party (to include the President, Chancellor, Faculty Athletics Representative, Governor, Mayor, ASUH President, UHF Board Chair, UHAA Board Chair, and Board of Regents) were invited by the Chancellor and allowed to bring a guest. Airfare and lodging were offered. Other University employees such as Chancellor's office staff important for media, communications, events, and logistics were invited and offered airfare, per diem, and lodging. The opportunity to bring a guest was not offered.

Note: Governor, Mayor, UHF Board Chair, UHAA Board Chair, and many Regents either declined our offer or paid for some or all of the costs incurred.

6. Associate athletics directors, assistant athletics directors, and other athletic administrative staff were invited and allowed to bring their spouse and up to two children. Airfare, lodging, and per diem were offered. A couple of athletic administrators or staff that were brought as chaperones on the final two charters that brought the band, cheer, and dance team were not offered the opportunity to bring children due to seats not being available on the charter. All of the individuals invited in this group had a specific working responsibility to perform in support of the Sugar Bowl appearance.
7. Per diem for coaches, administrators, and staff was calculated according to their Bargaining Unit and/or University policy.
8. The UH Band and cheerleaders were required to attend four different functions and perform at the Sugar Bowl. Additionally, the Sugar Bowl hosted a party for the band and cheerleading squads of the participating schools. We included the dance team in the travel party. This group was limited to the number of seats that were available on the last two charters less seats for members of the official party and administrators and staff serving as chaperones. The Band Director determined the travel party for the band and the Dance Team. The Cheerleading Team was limited by the BCS to 20 participants and one coach.
9. Tickets were provided as documented below:
 - a. Student-Athletes received up to six each according to NCAA Bylaw 16.2.1.1.1.
 - b. Coaches received tickets per their contract allocation. There was an additional allocation of up to 20 tickets for the head coach to address needs identified by the head coach and approved by the athletics director (football alumni and other guests).
 - c. Support personnel (doctors, trainers, equipment managers, student workers, etc.) who traveled with the team through the season received the same number of tickets that they could receive for all other away games.
 - d. Members of the official party and athletic administrators received one ticket each and one ticket per approved guest.
 - e. All Athletics Department employees including coaches of other sports, administrators, staff, Ahahui Koa Ānuenue staff and academic support services staff who traveled on their own to the game received two complimentary tickets upon arrival at the Sugar Bowl site.
 - f. Per Sugar Bowl policies members of the band, cheerleaders, dance team, mascot (professional entertainer), and participating student-athletes were granted complimentary admission. Sixty sideline credentials were allocated to the coaching staff, athletic trainers, equipment managers, and student-assistants. A limited number of working administrators received credentials allowing access to various parts of the stadium. All others were required to have a ticket.

tion period) as a regular student in a minimum full-time academic load, or awards received by a student-athlete while representing the student-athlete's institution at any other time. Such awards may not include cash, gift certificates, a cash-equivalent award (an item that is negotiable for cash or trade or other services, benefits or merchandise) for athletics participation, or a country club or sports club membership.

16.1.1.3 Student-Athlete Not Regularly Enrolled. Awards received by a student-athlete participating in an event while not enrolled as a regular student during the academic year, or received during the summer while not representing his or her institution, shall conform to the regulations of the recognized amateur organization that governs the competition. Such awards may include gift certificates, but may not include cash.

16.1.1.3.1 Olympic Games. It is permissible for a student-athlete to receive a non monetary award associated with participation in the Olympic Games at any time regardless of when the Games are held or whether the student-athlete is enrolled as a regular student during the academic year. (*Adopted: 11/1/00*)

16.1.1.4 After Completion of Athletics Eligibility. Awards limitations apply to enrolled student-athletes who have exhausted their collegiate athletics eligibility. An institution shall be held responsible through the Association's enforcement procedures for the provision of improper awards to graduating seniors by the institution or its booster organizations. Awards to graduating seniors may not include cash, gift certificates, a cash-equivalent award (an item that is negotiable for cash or trade or other services, benefits or merchandise) for athletics participation, or country club or sports club membership.

16.1.2 Uniformity of Awards. Awards presented by a member institution, conference or other approved agency must be uniform for all team members receiving the award.

16.1.3 Transfer of Nonpermissible Award. Cash or any other award that an individual could not receive under NCAA legislation may not be forwarded in the individual's name to a different individual or agency (e.g., a collegiate institution).

16.1.4 Types of Awards, Awarding Agencies, Maximum Value and Numbers of Awards. Athletics awards given to individual student-athletes shall be limited to those approved or administered by the member institution, its conference or an approved agency as specified in the following subsections and shall be limited in value and number as specified in this section. Awards received for intercollegiate athletics participation may not be sold, exchanged or assigned for another item of value, even if the student-athlete's name or picture does not appear on the award. Each of the following subsections is independent of the others so that it is permissible for an individual student-athlete to receive the awards described in all subsections. (*Revised: 9/12/03*)

16.1.4.1 Participation Awards. Awards for participation in intercollegiate athletics may be presented each year, limited in value and number as specified in Figure 16-1. Awards for participation in special events may be provided only to student-athletes eligible to participate in the competition. (*Revised: 4/25/02 effective 8/1/02*)

16.1.4.1.1 Senior Scholar-Athlete Award. An institution may provide a maximum of two senior scholar-athlete awards each year to graduating seniors. The award may consist of a tangible item valued at not more than \$175 and a postgraduate scholarship not to exceed \$5,000. The postgraduate scholarship shall be used for graduate studies at the recipient's choice of institution and shall be disbursed directly to that institution. Such a scholarship only may be awarded to a student-athlete who has completed the requirements for a baccalaureate degree. A student-athlete who has received an institutional postgraduate scholarship as part of a senior scholar-athlete award shall no longer be eligible to participate in intercollegiate athletics, except that the student may complete the remainder of any season currently in progress at the time of the award (e.g., postseason competition in the spring sport that occurs after graduation). (*Adopted: 4/25/02; Revised: 6/1/06*)

16.1.4.2 Awards for Winning Conference and National Championships. Awards for winning an individual or team conference or national championship may be presented each year, limited in value and number as specified in Figure 16-2. Awards for winning a conference or national championship in a team sport may be provided only to student-athletes who were eligible to participate in the championship event. The total value of any single award received for a national championship may not exceed \$415. The total value of any single award received for a conference championship may not to exceed \$325, and each permissible awarding agency is subject to a separate \$325 limit per award. Each permissible awarding agency may provide only a single award for each championship to each student-athlete. Separate awards may be presented to both the regular-season conference champion and the postseason conference champion (with a separate \$325 limitation), but if the same institution wins both the regular-season and postseason conference championship, the combined value of both awards shall not exceed \$325. (*Revised: 4/25/02 effective 8/1/02*)

16.1.4.3 Special Achievement Awards. Awards may be provided each year to individual student-athletes and teams to recognize special achievements, honors and distinctions, limited in value and number as specified in Figure 16-3. (*Revised: 4/25/02 effective 8/1/02*)

16.1.4.4 Local Civic Organization. A local civic organization (e.g., Rotary Club, Touchdown Club) may provide awards to a member institution's team(s). The following regulations shall apply to such an event: (*Adopted: 1/10/92*)
