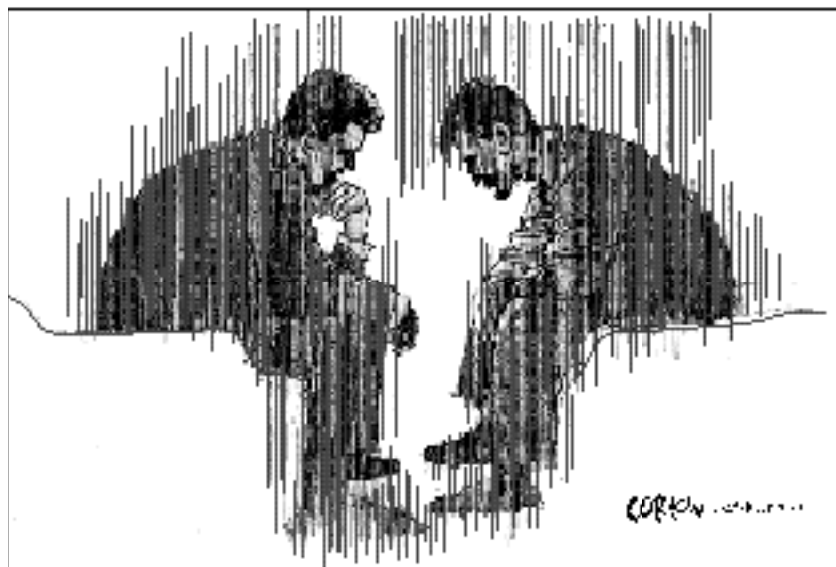


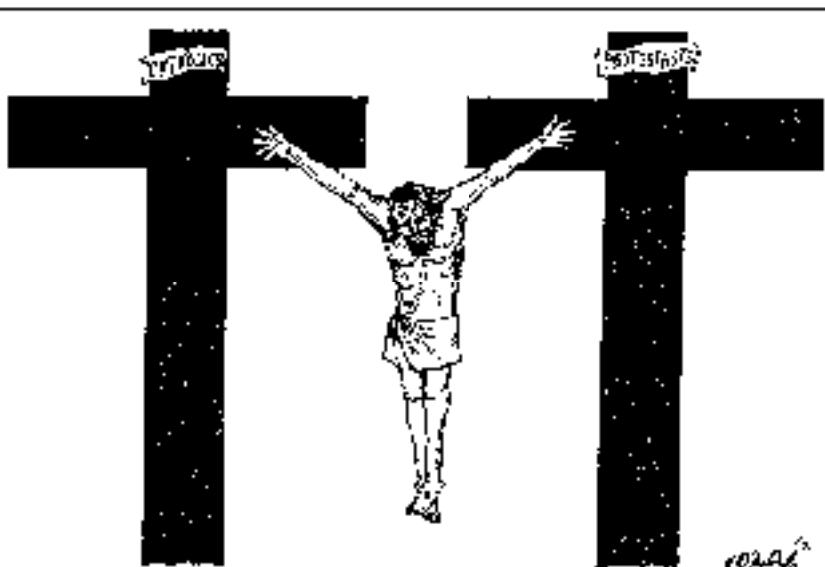
CORKY Looks back on 30 years

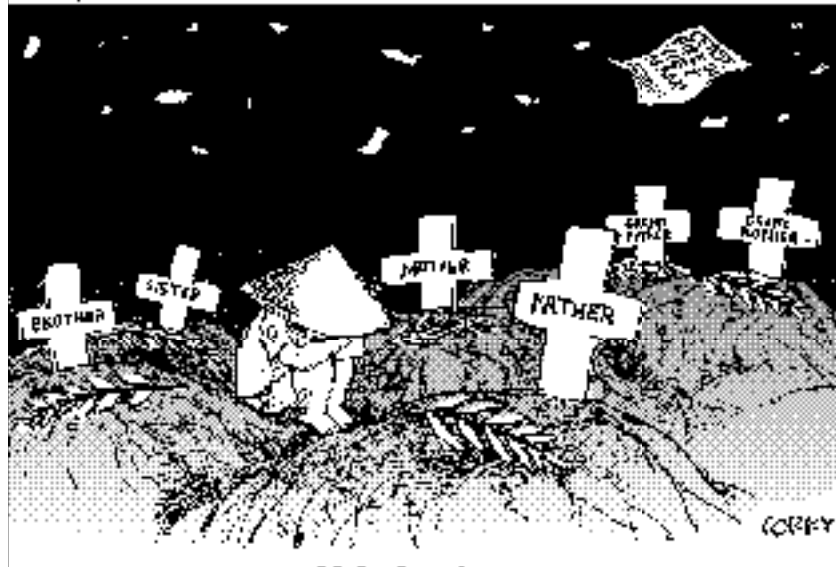

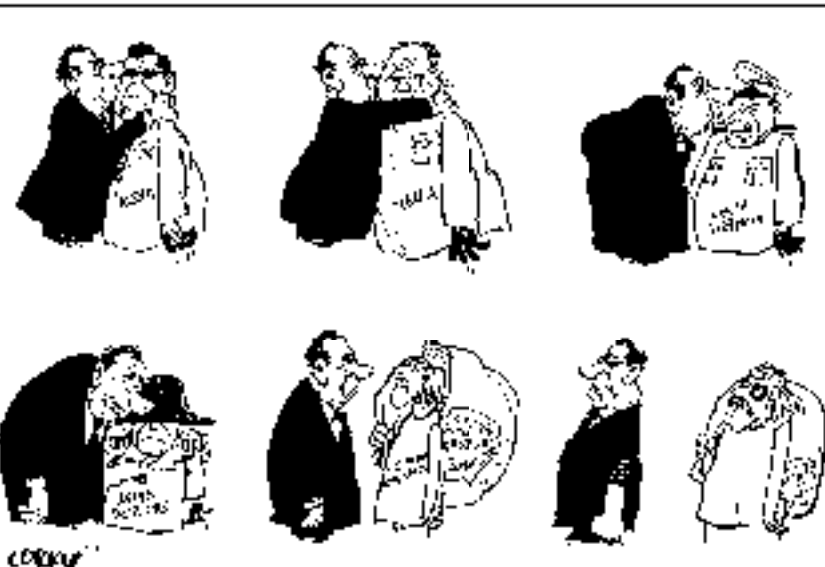

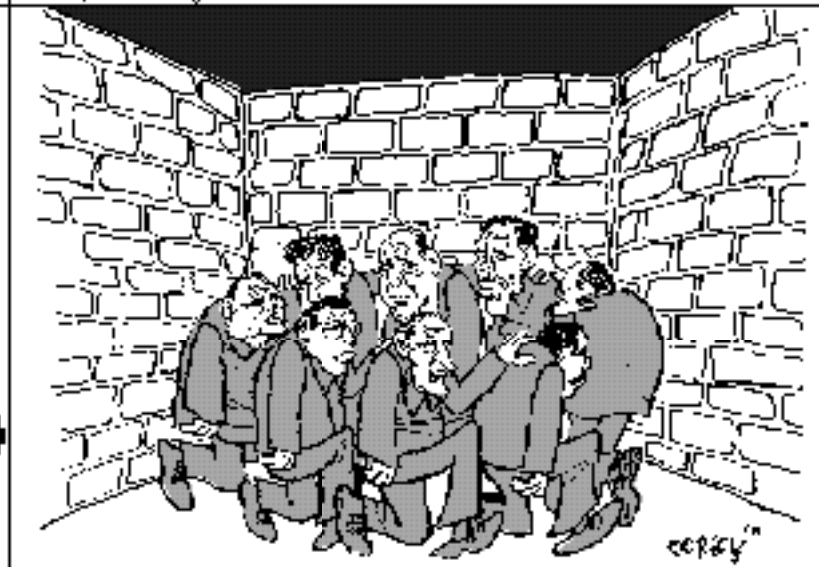

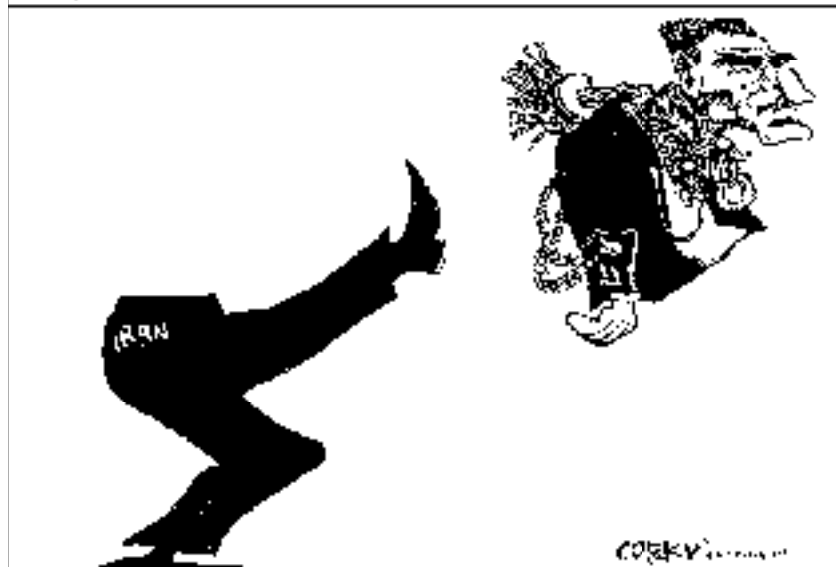

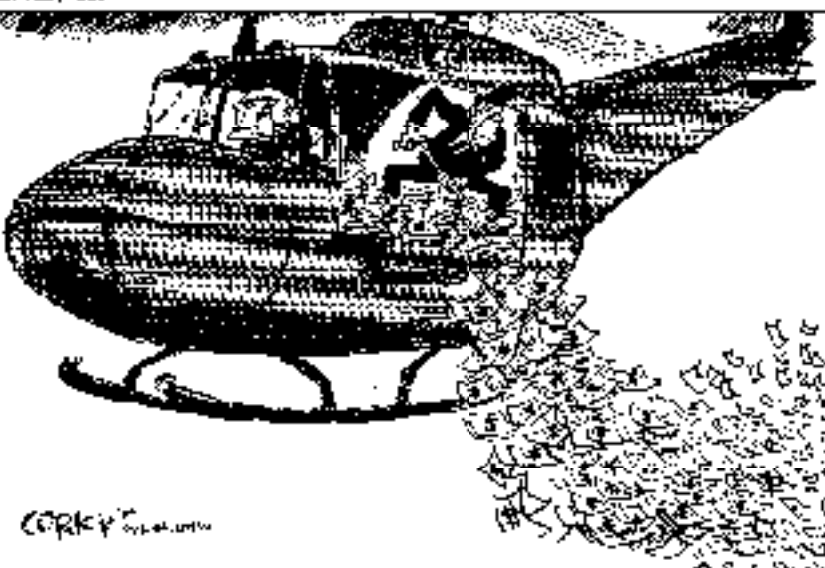

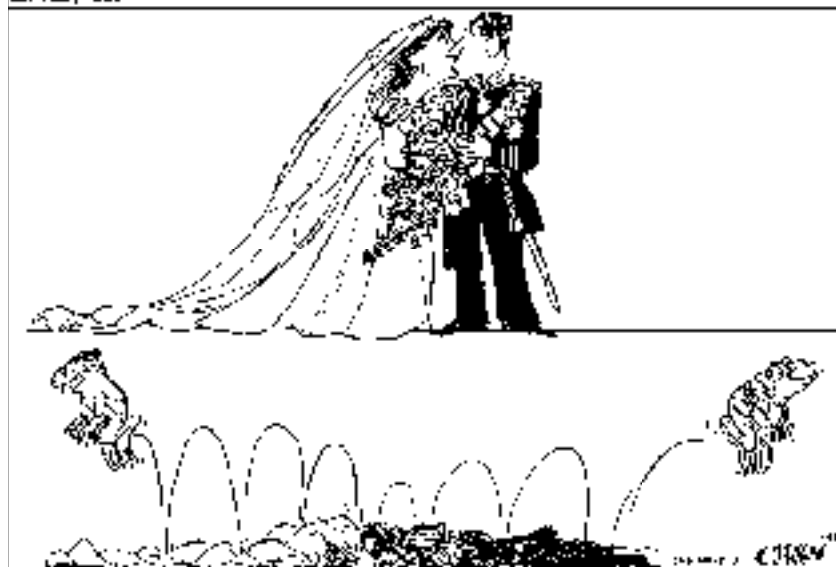

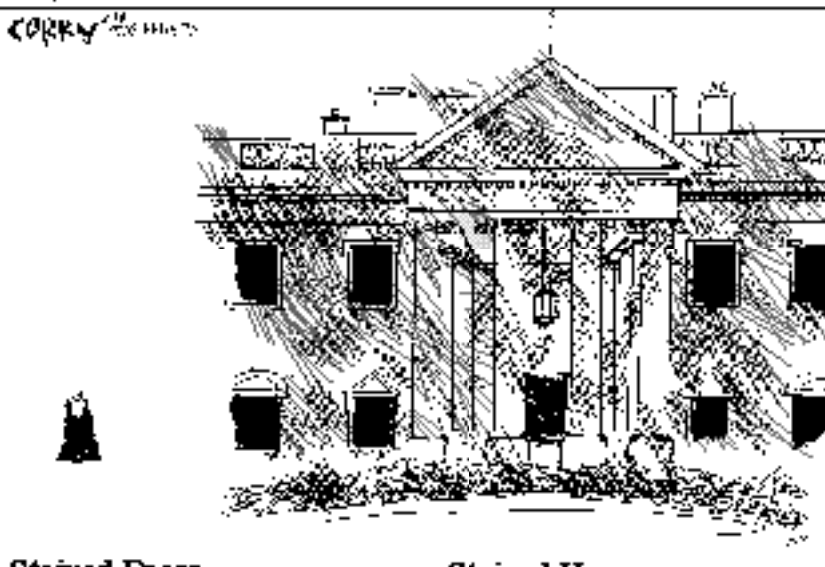

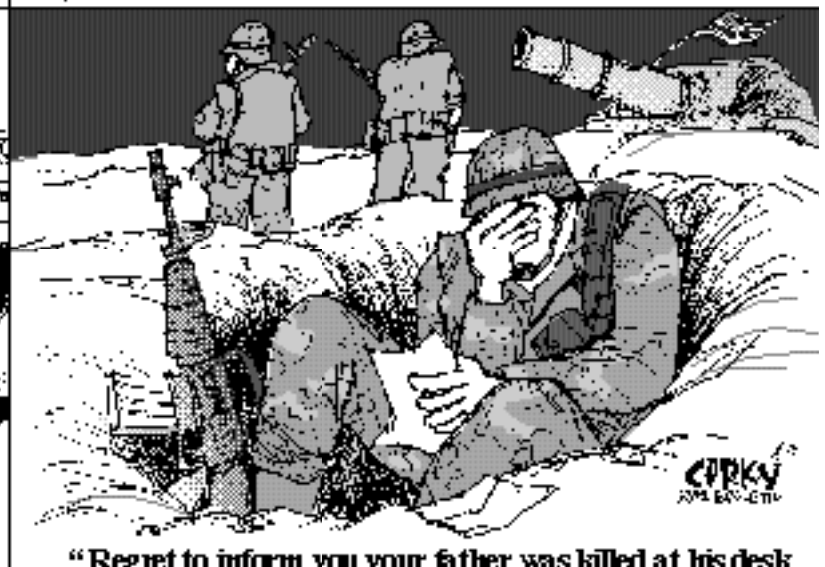
